


# BEERS of MONTH






#### 5.3% ABV and 35 IBUs

Legend has it that, well over a century ago, citizens of western Bohemia grew so dissatisfied with their beer they dumped it in the streets. So a new style evolved, in the city of Pilsen, combining the soft local water with pale malts and earthy Saaz hops. And the Bohemians were pleased. This pilsner adheres closely to that original style. 'Cause they dig happy Bohemians.




## 5.5% ABV and 52 IBUs

Named for one of Western North
Carolina's most iconic landmarks. A classic
American style Pale Ale brewed with British
Pale and Caramel Malts, and aggressively
hopped with Cascade for superior aroma
and flavor. In name and in taste, this one's
a landmark beer.



#### 5.8% ABV and 38 IBUs

Porters: consider them the mild-mannered granddaddy of stouts. This version stays true to the classic English style popularized by the Industrial Revolution's working class. Ruby-hued with strong upfront notes of chocolate and toffee, People's Porter finishes strong and flavorful, blending delicious herbal hop flavor and just a hint of espresso. Bloody terrific!



## 6.25% ABV and 78 IBUs

The recipe is simple: take some hoppy and add some yum. Nutty malts lend a surprisingly sweet base to copious additions of tangerine-y Simcoe™ hops. Great aroma, superior taste, clean dry finish. One sip will show you why this is their most popular beer . . . followed closely by a strong desire to take another sip.

It seems simple: Water. Yeast. Grains. Hops. That's all it takes to make beer. But what Foothills does with those simple ingredients within their walls is what makes them special. Foothills began brewing beer in March 2005, with three 15-barrel fermenters. Jamie and his brewers managed to crank out 800 barrels of beer that year, and doubled that output the following year. As demand and production continued to increase, the need became obvious for more space. Today the brewery has 2 locations and continue to produce their top-quality beers.
